

How VQ Conference Manager supports Cisco PMP/SMP licensing

VQ Conference Manager makes it straightforward to set up, manage and monitor your Cisco PMP and SMP license usage

Understanding Cisco PMP/SMP licensing

Most Cisco Meeting Server customers opt to use Personal Multiparty Plus and Shared Multiparty Plus licensing

If this applies to you, you need a way of assigning the right licenses to each of your video conferencing user groups.

Without VQ Conference Manager, this would normally involve manually using the Cisco Meeting Server API.

Allocate licenses in an easy-to-understand interface

VQ Conference Manager enables you to set user groups as PMP or SMP, using a checkbox

VQ Conference Manager looks after user provisioning by importing groups of users from your corporate LDAP server to the Cisco Meeting Server. When you set this up for each user group, tick a box to define their user type.

This is significantly faster and simpler than using the API.

Migrate from legacy licensing models

If you're updating the software on your Acano Call Bridge or upgrading to Cisco infrastructure, you'll most likely need to switch to PMP/SMP licensing

VQ Conference Manager enables you to apply PMP/SMP licensing to your existing setup with minimal disruption, keeping your users, coSpaces and associated settings, such as PINs and call identifiers, in place.

This removes the risks associated with attempting this change using the call bridge API.

Keep tabs on your license usage

Understand how your Cisco PMP and SMP licenses are being used

A real-time dashboard in VQ Conference Manager shows you how many PMP and SMP licences you own, and how many of each are currently in use.

These insights will help you make timely and informed decisions about future licence requirements.
